New Year, New Clothes!

Depending on what we do for a job, we need to dress a certain way for work. When we leave our homes to run errands, meet friends, or go to church, we likely will take a quick look in the mirror before we leave. What does my hair look like? Is my tie straight? Do I have any breakfast on my face? Do my clothes match?

At the beginning of a new year, many people make resolutions in their lives. Some resolve to be better students or spouses, parents or friends. Others resolve to eat better, to quit smoking, to get better organized, etc.



God gives us a perfect New Year's resolution, and it has to do with how we dress as Christians: "You were taught...to put on the new self, created after the likeness of God in true righteousness and holiness." (Ephesians 4:24)

Through our baptism, the Holy Spirit has brought into God's family and we have been made new. The old

sinful nature and its filthy rags of immorality and disobedience have been taken away, only to be exchanged with robes of righteousness Jesus has provided for us through his redemption. In other words, Jesus gives us everything we need to live new and holy lives. God has adopted us into his family, equipped us to love, serve, and praise him. One of the ways we do that is by putting on our new self daily, just as we put on our new clothes every morning, empowered by God to live for him instead of ourselves or as slaves to the devil.

No matter what we choose in terms of our clothes choices each morning, let's continue to be the new person God has already made us to be by his grace: baptized and redeemed children of the King. These are the only clothes that will fit us eternally!

Grow in 2024!

Without a plan to do something, plans often fail. We may have the genuine desire to grow in our faith, but sometimes life gets in the way. We may *want* to get into God's Word on a more regular basis, but too often



those noble plans end up buried by "I don't have time today...maybe tomorrow."

So how can we turn our good intentions into reality? Make a plan. Below you'll find a

number of different ways you can take to heart the apostle Peter's encouragement to "grow in grace." Start small. Make a plan to connect yourself to the means of grace more often...those tools the Holy Spirit uses to nurture faith. Establish a habit, then come back and spend a few minues more for more and add another 5 or 15 minutes to the mix.

Start with the easy ones...come to church regularly to be fed spiritually with God's Word and the Lord's Supper. But then consider other ways God promises will feed your faith. God will bless your time with him in his Word and Sacrament.

Meditations Our congregation has a standing order for these daily devotions, based on the readings you'll hear in church. Each devotion offers a Scripture reading, devotion and prayer. It's a quarterly publication and you'll find them in church before each quarter begins.

Seasonal Devotions For the past several years we've been receiving Advent and Lenten devotional booklets. Well-written and illustrated, they're perfect for the busy person who only has 3-4 minutes (seasonal).

Book Devotions Available from our publishing house (<u>online.nph.net</u>), you'll find 5 Minute Bible Studies for Teens, Couples, and Families. Other excellent devotional books include "The Story Bible" (for kids), "364 Days of Thanksgiving," anything written by Richard Lauersdorf, and much more. Check the website.

The Annual meeting is scheduled for Monday, January 22nd. So what happens at these meetings and why are they important? These meetings

provide financial and decision-making transparency, and allow two-way



communication between leadership and the membership. On that night we'll hear reports from the various areas of ministry here at Zion, take into consideration some recommendations from the long range facilities committee, approve

the annual budget, elect a few new leaders, etc... You're invited to join us on the 22nd.

Long Range Facilities Recommendations At the Annual meeting later this month, the Council (at the recommendation of our Long Range Facilities committee) will be recommending we replace the parsonage roof, a portion of the fellowship hall roof, and add insulation to the ceiling in the church proper. The estimated costs to complete these projects will be about \$18,000.

New Internet and Phone The Council recently decided to take advantage of the recent Spectrum cable lines that were run across County Road D from the church. Installation is scheduled to occur in the next month or so. By switching, we should see increased internet speeds, have the capability to livestream services and events and decrease the overall cost of those services. We hope to retain our old landline phone number, but that is still up in the air.

Worship Focus in January / February For most of his adult life, Jesus was known simply as Mary's son. He followed his adoptive father, Joseph, into the carpentry business. People in his hometown of Nazareth probably



thought of Jesus as a very nice man—hardworking, honest, a role model for others. (That is still how many think of Jesus today.) But around the age of 30, the fuller truth about Jesus began to be revealed: his person, his power, his purpose. It started with Jesus standing in a river with John the Baptist. The biggest epiphany took place

at a mountain, where select followers saw Jesus shining brighter than the sun. All these epiphanies—all these revelations about Jesus—changed the lives of everyone around him. In this season of Epiphany, as we follow

Jesus from the Jordan river to the Mount of Transfiguration, may they change us too.
