From Whom?

The four lines of what is known as the Common Doxology have been sung for over three centuries:

Praise God from whom all blessings flow.

Praise Him all creatures here below.

Praise Him above, ye heavenly host.

Praise Father, Son, and Holy Ghost.

The Doxology, which literally means "words of glory," teaches God's providence and preservation, reminding us that everything we have is literally a gift from heaven. We have a God who made the heavens rain bread and quail when Israel was wandering in the desert to keep them



alive. We have the same God who continues to shower down blessing upon blessing so that we might remember that God is good and the One from whom all blessings flow.

We are not thankful in some general way, wondering if there actually is someone to

whom we should be offering our gratitude. We know from where and from whom our blessings flow. As James wrote: "Every good and perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of the heavenly lights..."

May we never be merely "thankful in general," as in "I'm very thankful for all my blessings. More than that, He is the Source of our salvation and the One who sent us a Savior. Praise God from whom all blessings flow!

Happy Anniversary! It was November 3rd, 1949 - some 75 years ago - that



18 ladies from Zion gathered together for the first time to form what is now known as the Ladies' Aid.

There were a number of reasons why those 18 ladies decided to found a Ladies' Aid

group. Among them were to provide opportunities for Bible study and to foster Christian fellowship, to beautify the church and property, and to assist in charitable work among our fellow Christians and throughout the synod.

That has translated into coordinating countless congregational dinners and funeral luncheons, serving as an altar guild, providing much needed furnishings to beautify the church, hosting Advent by Candlelight, movie nights, fall festivals, organizing food drives, serving as co-hosts for the Lutheran Women's Missionary Society (LWMS) gatherings, customizing baptismal napkins, providing greeting cards for all occasions, and much, much more.

If you would ask most pastors, they would tell you that if there is a need somewhere, if there is a service that needs to be provided, the ladies' group would be the first group to call. Open Doors Around the World When WELS was first invited to communist Vietnam to share the good news of salvation through Jesus, it



was a surprise. Yet, God opened that door, and WELS members responded with generosity and faith to support that opportunity.

Since we began working with the Hmong Fellowship Church, it has grown from 55,000 members to 145,000. What will God use us to do next? Christians who have heard the gospel for the first time are

moved by our Lord to reach out to others who still need to hear it. The leaders we train and equip are reaching hearts, and the Holy Spirit is granting a harvest.

And God continues to surprise us *all around the world*. God is blessing our prayers and contributions by providing open doors all over the world through WELS World Missions. The door is open. The manpower is ready. The gospel is powerful. God has provided WELS with opportunities in Australia, London, New Zealand, Tanzania, and the Congo over the last two years. Dozens of house churches have opened in Latin America and Africa. We boldly ask God's people to help keep these gospel doors open.

"See, I have placed before you an open door that no one can shut" (Revelation 3:8).

Hurricane Relief Update After Hurricanes Milton and Helene, WELS Christian Aid and Relief teams went to the affected areas, visiting WELS churches and members. A number of members of WELS churches had varying levels of damage to their personal properties. Some have extensive damage from storm surge entering their homes. There is also

quite a bit of tree damage and debris that needs to be cleaned up in the area of impact. Local volunteers are being utilized as much as possible to help, but volunteers with special skills are also being brought in.

Job Opening KML has 1-2 positions available for an evening janitor. The




